Flyfishing Northern New England's Seasons

By Lou Zambello

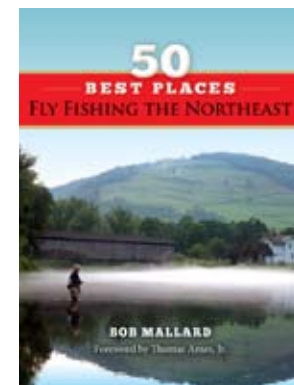
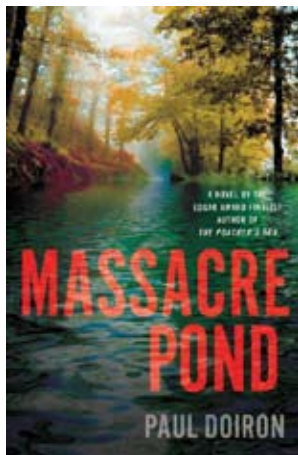
Much has been written about the many famous American flyfisheries, but relatively little has been logged regarding the glorious brook-trout and landlocked salmon water of northern New England. Thanks to long-time fishing guide Lou Zambello, we'll soon be enlightened. Covering Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont and western Massachusetts, Zambello relates years of flyfishing and guiding experience through observations, instructions and anecdotes. From ice-out through summer, fall spawning runs and back to winter - for lakes as well as rivers and streams, all conditions and strategies are covered. You'll learn the proper conditions to try new tactics like dead-drifting a streamer versus twitching dry flies, and much more. He relates stories from such famous waters as the Kennebec, Penobscot, Grand Lake Stream, Rapid, Presumpscot, Androscoggin, and Deerfield Rivers, and Rangeley, Moosehead and Sebago Lakes, and many more throughout the region. Even if you're an experienced northern New England angler, you'll find many useful morsels of information throughout this guide. And certainly if you're a rookie, you'll want this book.



50 Best Places to Fly Fish in the Northeast

These murder mysteries feature a Registered Maine Guide named Stoney Calhoun. Set in the Greater Portland area, the three books were the last that "Tap" wrote before his death in 2009 and take the reader from the trout ponds of southwestern Maine, to the Islands of Casco Bay to the depths of the northwoods wilderness.

Weatherby's Producing Electricity

About 6 years ago, we took the initiative to install a solar hot water system for our lodge which produces 140 gallons of hot water daily and displaced three electric hot water heaters. Fall of 2013, Revision Energy installed a 5.6 kW grid-tied solar electric array at Weatherby's. The system utilizes 22- 255 watt photovoltaic panels made by Canadian Solar and an SMA 5000TL inverter. The PV array is located on the back outbuilding adjacent to the building with the solar thermal collectors that were installed back in 2008. The solar electric array will generate electricity that will either be used first by any operating loads or if there is excess, the power will be sent to the grid, resulting in a credit. This 5.6 kW array is expected to generate roughly 6,000 kWh per year and will offset 5,500 lbs of carbon dioxide emissions annually. In addition to the environmental benefits, the system also made great economic sense. Taking advantage of current incentives reduced the initial installation cost by 67%. With an expected life span of 25-40 years, the system will be making power for a few more generations of sportsmen staying at Weatherby's.



NEW: North Woods Grouse Camp 2014

Most grouse hunters put down their shotguns by the end of October, even though grouse hunting season runs through to the end of December. Typically early November can provide some of the best grouse hunting of the season with cold temps and good visibility in the woods. Beginning late October/November 2014, we will be guiding small parties of hunters in the "big woods" of northern Maine. Grouse populations tend to run high in this region of the state with some days producing 30+ grouse flushes. We will be renting some rustic spike camps in the Allagash region that will be able to accommodate a party of four adults. The hunts will be fully guided and outfitted 2:1, meals included. The cabins are clean, comfortable and warm. There will be no running water or electricity adding to the ambiance of the hunt. 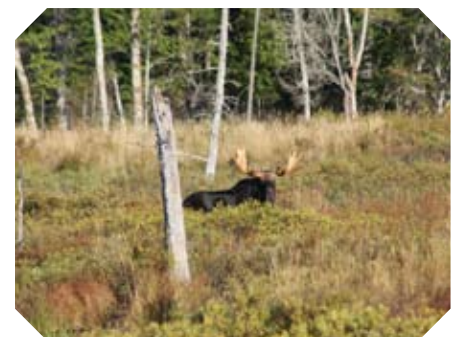


Finite Carbon and the Downeast Lakes Land Trust in November 2013 announced the nation's first issuance of California Air Resources Board Offset Credits for a forestry project. Nearly 200,000 compliance offsets were issued for the Farm Cove Improved Forest Management Project in eastern Maine. The initial offsets have been contracted to two non-disclosed compliance buyers in the first

sales of registered and issued forestry offsets for California's greenhouse gas cap and trade program.

Located on 19,118 forested acres owned and managed by Downeast Lakes Land Trust, the Farm Cove Project was the first Climate Action Reserve Improved Forest Management project developed and registered outside of California. Forest offset projects are one of four offset types allowed under the Air Resources Board greenhouse gas emissions trading program that launched on January 1, 2013. Under the Air Resources Board program, regulated emitters may use approved and verified offset projects to meet up to eight percent of their emissions cap.

The Farm Cove Project was one of only two forest offset projects included in the California Air Resources Board inaugural listing of compliance offset projects in March 2013. As an early action forestry project for the California program, Farm Cove achieved dual verification to ensure project integrity by the Rainforest Alliance and Environmental Services, Inc. In addition, the forest management practices of Downeast Lakes Land Trust have been audited and certified by the Rainforest Alliance as meeting the environmental and social criteria of the Forest Stewardship Council.
